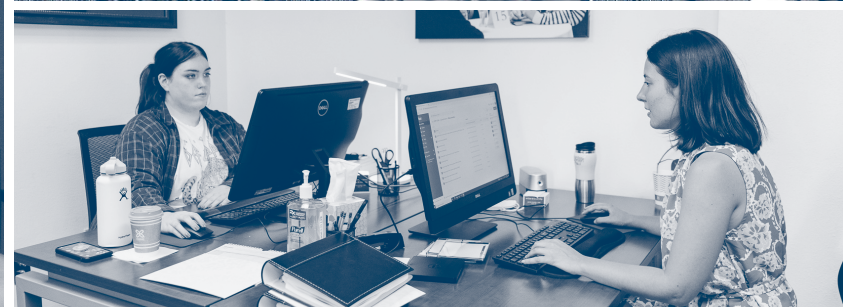
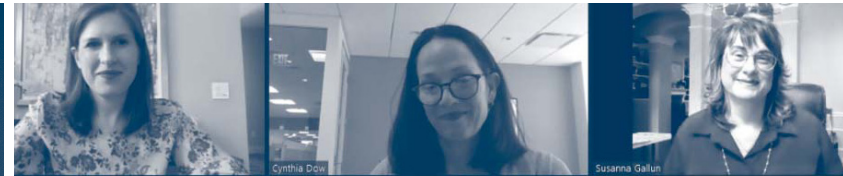

ACCELERATE: FIRST-YEAR ASSOCIATES™

Our Accelerate: First-Year Associates™ program provides a unique opportunity for women associates to practice key skills that will accelerate the transition from law student to lawyer while developing strong and diverse networks outside of the law firm.

Helping first-year associates navigate the transition from law student to first-year practicing lawyer was never more important than in such a tumultuous and challenging climate as a global pandemic.

Our 2021 program kicked off March 1 with **70 first-year associates**. We'd like to thank our Benefactor level sponsors for their support of this year's program: **Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP, Katten Muchin Rosenman LLP, Haynes and Boone, LLP, and Kirkland & Ellis.**

While the pandemic forced us to pivot from our traditional in-person programming and round-table discussions, our Accelerate: First-Year Associates™ program delivered quality programming and networking opportunities through a series of virtual events with 70 first-year associates in ten cities, five states, and representing seven firms. Since the program's inception in 2017, approximately 150 first-year associates have benefited from the year-long program.

Our Perspectives Series delivers timely, relevant public policy and professional development discussions with experts in their fields. These Center for Women in Law events also provide an opportunity for the Center to reach an even wider audience not only through our virtual programming but with timely and topical discussions appealing to a wide range of professional women leaders and the general public.

Finding Humanity and Peace in Justice: Perspectives on Law Enforcement Reform featured Vera Bumpers, Chief of the Houston Metro Police; Danielle Outlaw, Chief of the Philadelphia Police Department, and UT Law Professor Jennifer Laurin, moderating a lively discussion on the state of law enforcement and trends in reform across the United States. Our September 2020 Perspectives Series event drew more than 150 participants who watched the live-stream of our event.

Bridging the Career Gap: Successfully Reentering the Legal Workforce, our June 2021 Perspective Series event, was presented in partnership with Mother Attorney Mentor Association of Austin (MAMAs).

Returning to the legal profession after spending time in another field or out of the workforce can be a challenge, one that is especially relevant during the pandemic as work-life balance forced many women lawyers to reevaluate or reorient their careers. Our discussion featured Cynthia Dow, head of the Legal, Regulatory & Compliance Officers Practice at Russell Reynolds; Susanna Gallun, Attorney-at-Law, and a Research Engineer, Scientist Assistant at The University of Texas at Austin, Center for Transportation Research; Michelle Jackson, Director, Pathway & Recruitment Innovations at the On Ramp Fellowship; and, Eileen Lawrence, Owner, Law Office of Eileen Lawrence. Karen Vladeck, Partner at Wittliff Cutler, PLLC, moderated the event.

Our virtual panel of experts addressed ways to bridge the career gap by leveraging networks, maintaining and updating skills, mentorship, and overcoming biases. The panel also addressed how legal employers can recruit, welcome, and retain lawyers re-entering the workforce.

Our June 2021 Perspectives Series event drew more than 100 registrants and provided an opportunity for the Center for Women in Law to collaborate with another fantastic women lawyers' organization to bring a meaningful program to both organizations' membership.

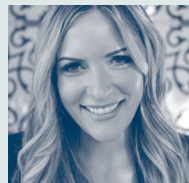

Discussion with Eve Rodsky, Author of Fair Play

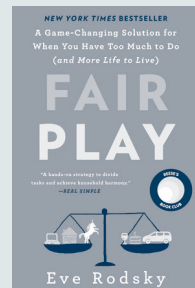
The pandemic has underscored the need for balanced workloads in the home, making our June 2021 **Ex Libris Series** event especially timely and relevant.

The Center hosted a virtual discussion with **Eve Rodsky, *New York Times* best-selling author of *Fair Play: A Game-Changing Solution for When You Have Too Much to Do (and More Life to Live)***. In her book, Rodsky uses her Harvard Law School training and years of organizational management experience to create a life-management system to help couples both re-balance all the work it takes to run a home and re-imagine their relationship, time and purpose.





The late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg and her husband, Marty Ginsburg, modeled a true partnership in pursuit of gender equity and their tireless, lifetime dedication to this issue will have a lasting impact on the legal profession and our society. To honor their legacy, the Center for Women in Law launched the **Ginsburg Initiative** in February 2021. Through

the Ginsburg Initiative, the Center will work to advance gender-neutral initiatives that support systemic change, such as best practices surrounding work assignments, performance expectations, parental leave, and transparency in career development.

Our inaugural event was a virtual panel discussion, **Justice Ginsburg's Impact on Gender Parity in the Practice of Law**. A panel of Justice Ginsburg's former clerks discussed how her mentorship shaped their personal and professional choices, and the ramifications of her leadership on gender parity in the practice of law. Nina Totenberg, NPR's legal affairs correspondent, joined the discussion, which was moderated by David Lat, founder of Above the Law and Original Jurisdiction.

To fund the initiative, the Center for Women in Law created the Ginsburg Circle consisting of donors making gifts of \$1,000 or more to support the initiative. We're grateful to the 30 founding donors to this new initiative.

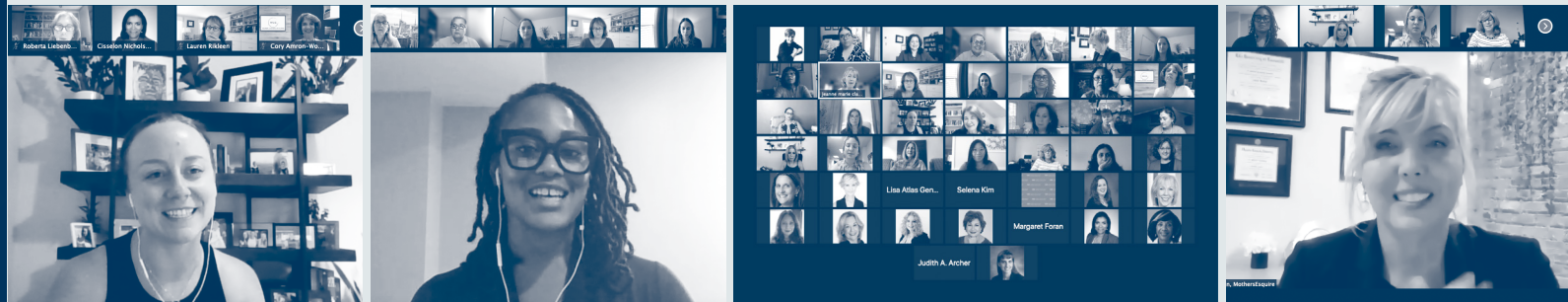

The Center for Women in Law honored the life and legacy of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg upon her passing on Sept. 18, 2020. Justice Ginsburg was a pioneer and trailblazer for women's rights and gender equality throughout her life and professional career.

In her own words, Justice Ginsburg described women's rights as "an essential part of the overall human rights agenda, trained on the equal dignity and ability to live in freedom all people should enjoy."
